Bloomberg's Center Accomplishments

The State Energy and Environmental Impact Center was quite aggressive in its efforts to claim credit for all of the actions taken by its "pro bono fellows" placed in state Attorneys General offices. The impression is that the Center directed or had an active role in every one of these legal challenges and policy disputes.

The Interior Department has also repealed common sense environmental rules governing fracking activities on public lands. And to ensure that wildlife interests do not get in the way of industrializing our public lands, the administration has rolled back vital Endangered Species Act (ESA) protections and reversed long-standing protections for migratory birds under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA)."

Enforcement (OSMRE) – do not maintain readily accessible databases of their compliance monitoring and enforcement activities."
